#### Overview

System and Program Indicator Reports are published quarterly and furnished to CSB trustees and the Continuum of Care. All reports are posted to <a href="www.csb.org">www.csb.org</a>. Results are also shared with CSB funders consistent with funding contracts and agreements.

The System and Program Indicator Report monitors the current CSB funded programs and some non-CSB funded programs that participate in our data system. The report evaluates each system and program based on a system or program goal, actual performance data, variances, and outcome achievements. Outcome achievement is defined as 90% or better of numerical goal or within 5 percentage points of a percentage goal, except where a lesser or greater value than this variance also indicates an achieved goal. Systems or programs which meet less than one-half of outcome goals are considered to be a "program of concern". The following key is used to express outcome achievement status for each indicator:

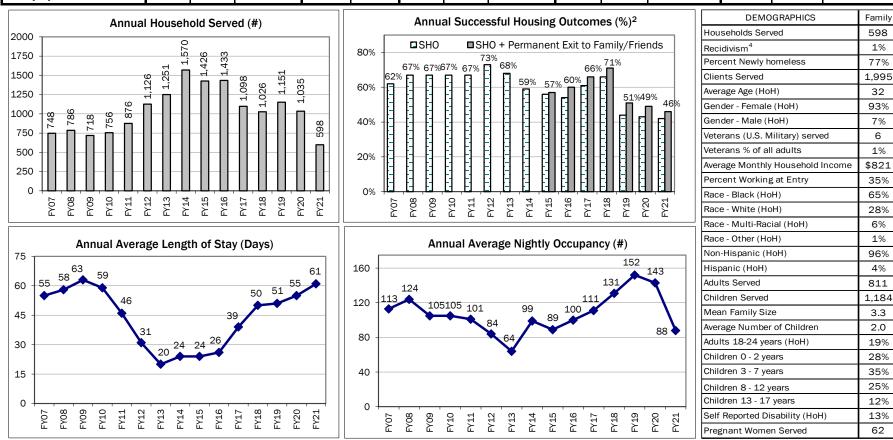

Covid-19 had a direct impact on the metrics monitored this period as re-housing activities were extremely difficult for our partners. 42% less households needed shelter when compared to FY20, likely impacted by the eviction moratorium, stimulus funds and unemployment benefits. The success rate at exit from shelters decreased 3 percentage points to 46%. The average length of shelter stay increased 6 days to 61 days. The employment rate at entry decreased from the FY20 annual rate of 41% to 35% currently, while the average income decreased to \$821 (FY20 \$847), impacted by the pandemic and affecting the housing abilities of our partners. 35% of families had more than one shelter stay during the timeframe. An additional 46 families stayed in the Overnight shelter program only, waiting for a face-to-face shelter eligibility assessment. These families were subsequently either diverted from shelter or self-exited.

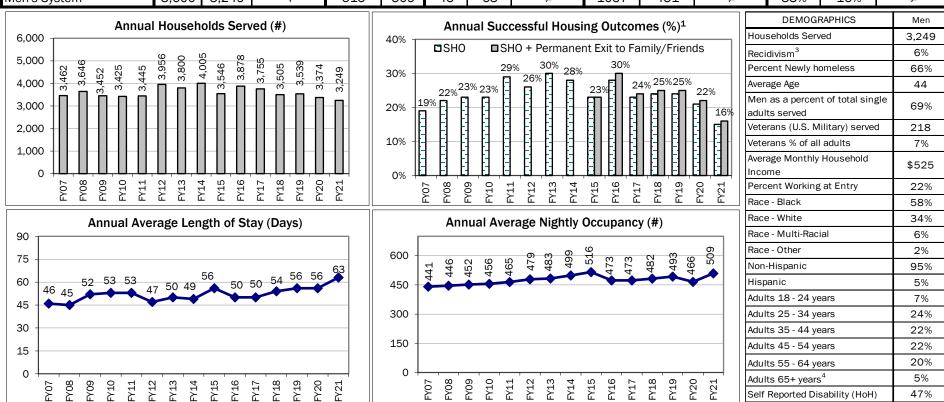

Covid-19 had a direct impact on the metrics monitored this period as re-housing activities were extremely difficult for our partners. The number of single men served decreased 4% when compared to the last fiscal year. Additional capacity was open throughout the reporting period. The success rate decreased 6 percentage points to 16%. The average length of time homeless increased 7 days from the prior reporting period, to 63 days. The employment rate at entry increased to 22% compared to the FY20 annual rate of 19%, coupled with an increase in average income to \$525 (FY20 \$414). On average, men had 3.3 different stays in shelters during the timeframe. The rapid rehousing program now only serves individuals with high needs and barriers, which makes outcome achievement more difficult for our partners.

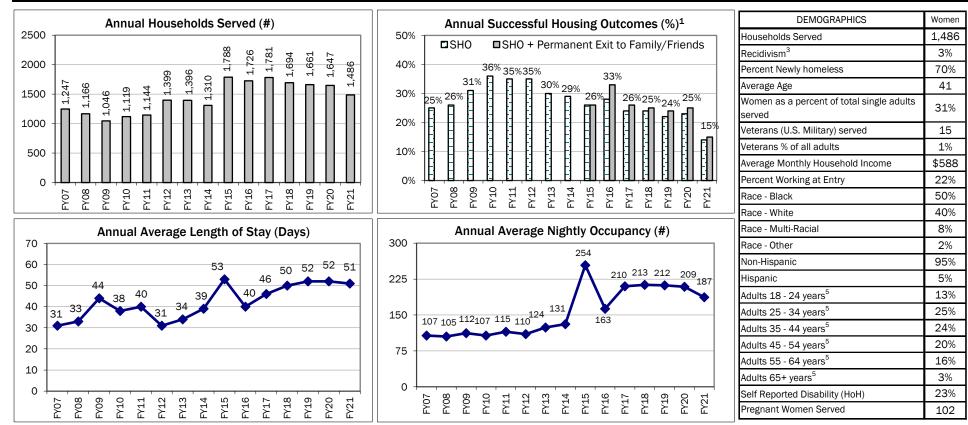

Covid-19 had a direct impact on the metrics monitored this period as re-housing activities were extremely difficult for our partners. The number of single women served decreased 10% when compared to the last fiscal year. The success rate decreased 10 percentage points to 15%. The average length of time homeless decreased by 1 day. The employment rate at entry decreased 4 percentage points to 22% when compared to the FY20 annual rate of 26%, while average income remained flat (FY21 \$587), impacted by the pandemic and affecting the housing abilities of our partners. On average women had 3.9 different stays in shelter during the timeframe. The rapid re-housing program now only serves individuals with high needs and barriers, per HUD guidelines, which makes outcome achievement more difficult for our partners.

Covid-19 had a direct impact on the metrics monitored this period as re-housing activities were extremely difficult for our partners. The system experienced a 12% decrease in the number of households sheltered, driven by the decrease in family homelessness. The number of veterans and pregnant women who needed shelter decreased by 107 (31%) and 106 (40%) respectively, during the same timeframe. The successful housing outcome rate decreased 9 percentage points compared to the same period of last fiscal year. The average length of time homeless increased by 5 days to 60 days. The average income increased when compared to the FY20 annual rate (\$554). 69% of sheltered households did not experience homelessness within the prior two years.

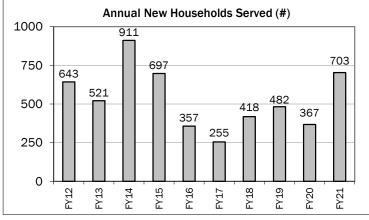

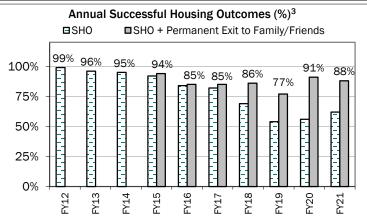

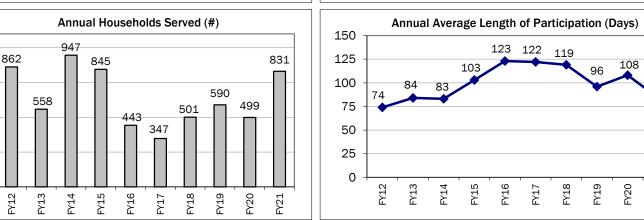

The number of households served increased 67% when compared to the last fiscal year. At exit, 64% of households are stable in their own housing and 24% decided to permanently move in with family/friends. The percent working at entry decreased compared to the FY20 annual rate (38%) to 28% currently, coupled with a decrease in income from \$729 to \$696, showing improved targeting, serving the most needy households. The number of pregnant women served increased compared to the last fiscal year by 42 (50%). The increase in this number correlates with the decrease in pregnant women served in emergency shelters.

The number served in Rapid Rehousing programs increased 3% when compared to the last fiscal year. Re-housing activities were extremely difficult for our partners in the COVID-19 environment. The success rate at exit decreased by 3 percentage points, to 58% currently and the length of participation significantly increased to 151 days. The rapid rehousing programs now only serve households with high needs and barriers, which makes outcome achievement more difficult. Rapid Re-housing system recidivism rate is 7%.

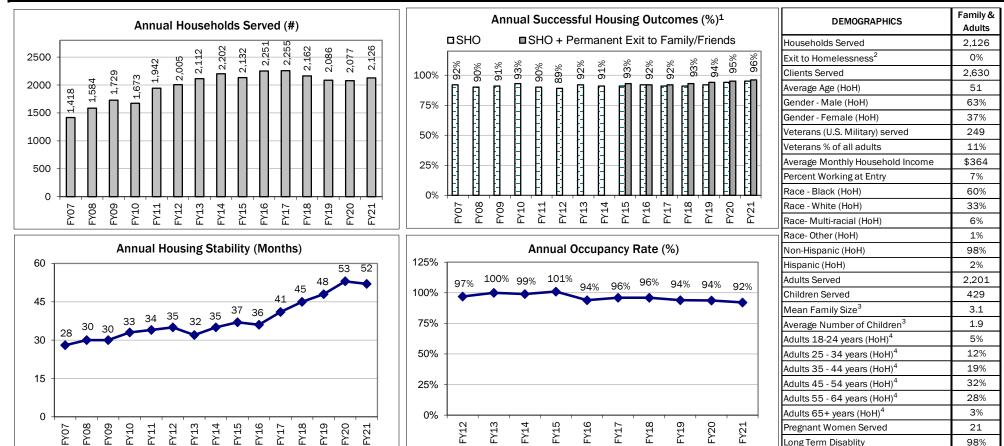

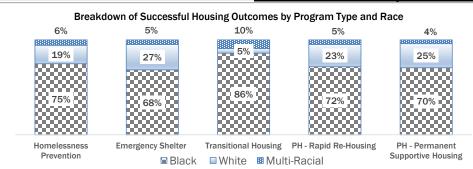

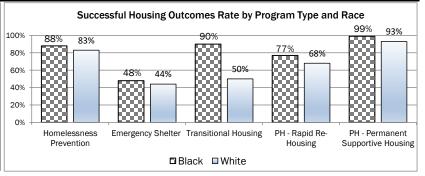

The system-wide number of families served increased by 5% compared to the last fiscal year. While the rate of families receiving homelessness prevention services increased by 83%, the rate of families in emergency shelter decreased by 42% during the same timeframe.

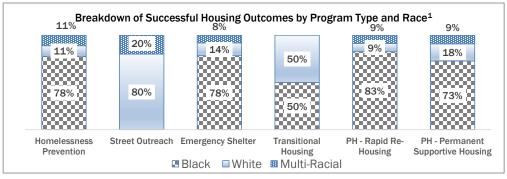

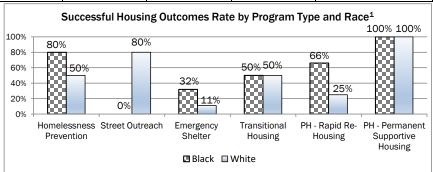

The system-wide number of pregnant women served decreased by 15 percent compared to the last fiscal year. 52% more pregnant women were served by homelessness prevention projects and 39% less pregnant women were served in emergency shelter.

The number of youth served in transitional housing and rapid rehousing increased 47% and 43% respectively. The number of youth served in PSH increased 296% due to the opening of Marsh Brook Place. The number of youth served by homelessness prevention projects increased 115% during the same timeframe. The number of youth served in emergency shelters decreased by 2%. The success rate at exit from rapid rehousing projects shows a significant increase compared to the prior year.

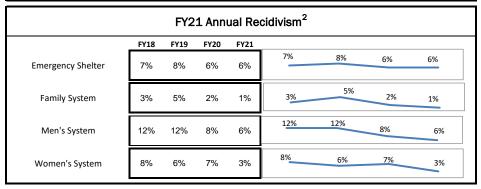

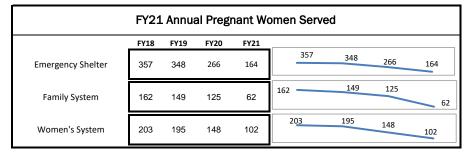
