#### Our Mission

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### Overview

The supplement to the Program Evaluation is issued for all Continuum of Care (CoC) programs that are not funded by the Community Shelter Board. This evaluation is intended to be a tool for the CoC Steering Committee in determining adequate funding of the evaluated programs.

For each program the report includes an overall performance rating, summary description, tables showing previous and current performance with respect to established outcome measures and recommendations, where applicable, for performance outcome measures for the upcoming FY2009 contract year.

## Data Sources

Program descriptions were developed from information provided by agencies and CSB Programs and Planning staff.

Unless otherwise noted, performance data was gathered from the Community Shelter Board's Homeless Management Information System (HMIS) for the 7/1/07 through 12/31/07 period. All data used in the report met CSB quality assurance standards, which require current data and a 95% completion rate for all required HMIS data variables.

## FY2008 Program Performance

Program performance outcome goals were compared with actual performance to determine consistency with CoC standards. For outcome definitions and methodologies, please see Appendix II to the CSB Program Evaluation.

Each performance goal was assessed as achieved (Yes), not achieved (No), or not applicable (N/A). Achieved Goal is defined as 90% or better of a numerical goal or within 5 percentage points of a percentage goal, except where a lesser or greater value than this variance also indicated an achieved goal (e.g. Average Length of Stay goal was met if actual achievement is 105% or less of goal). Not Applicable is assigned when a performance goal was not assigned; the reason for this is explained in the footnote for the respective program.

Each program was assigned an achievement rating of Yes or No as determined by overall program achievement of performance outcomes for the evaluation period. Ratings are based on the following:

#### A. Description

RSVP is a transitional housing and alcohol and drug treatment program for homeless women. The program is for women who do not need inpatient detoxification, but are having difficulty staying clean and sober long enough to access housing options. The women that come to Amethyst are homeless and addicted to alcohol and other drugs. Many have their children with them while others are in the process of reunifying their families after involvement with children's services. All of the women in the program are below 100% of the poverty level. Most likely, they have no more than a 10<sup>th</sup> grade education and have little or no job skills or experience. They have poor physical and mental health, with both chronic and acute problems in each. These problems are the effect of addiction, violence and living on the streets. They have cycled through unhealthy relationships and experience violence including incest, rape and other abuse dating back to childhood. They have past involvement with the criminal justice system on more than one occasion. Despite all of this, they have the hope for recovery, the desire to heal their lives and the lives of their children, and the courage to ask for help.

#### A. Description

The Transitional Living Program provides housing to multi-problem, older adolescent, homeless youth. The program is an 18 month program that serves youth 16.5 – 19 years of age. It also provides transitional housing for teen parents who have their own children.

The Transitional Living Program provides independent living skill instruction, mental health intervention, crisis support, assistance with access and linkage to community resources, educational and vocational support, education on human sexuality including parenting support and linkage to additional parenting/birthing classes, counseling services, and transitional services to obtain permanent housing.

#### A. Description

New Horizons Transitional Housing is based on HUD's Safe Haven Transitional Model, which is designed for unaccompanied adult men and women who have histories of chronic homelessness and a severe mental disability (SMD). Most residents are linked with a mental health treatment provider and documentation of their SMD is provided by their treatment provider. Many residents also struggle with a co-occurring substance use disorder, physical health problems, chronic unemployment, low income level, and lack of educational attainment. New Horizons provides a total of 36 transitional housing units: 24 for men and 12 for women. The goal of the program is to move residents into permanent housing.

#### A. Description

Volunteers of America of Greater Ohio operates a 40-bed transitional housing program for Veterans. Twenty beds are designated for drug and alcohol treatment; twenty beds are designated for pre-alcohol and drug treatment or transitional housing. The primary goals of the program are to assist homeless veterans to achieve residential stability, to increase income and/or skill level, and to develop greater self-determination.

Volunteers of America announced on 4/15/2008 the change in capacity for this program to 45 units, as of November 2007. A new program description and Program Outcomes Plan is expected to be received shortly.
