Our network includes partners delivering an array of services including homelessness prevention, shelter, rapid re-housing, street outreach, and supportive housing.

Community Shelter Board sets specific outcomes with each partner agency, and performance is measured and reported in the accompanying report. We monitor data constantly to track how effectively the system is working to move people to stable housing. We partner with agencies both individually and as a system to continuously improve results.

Along the way, we relish the opportunity to take a moment to recognize the tireless efforts by these partners delivering critical services to those facing homelessness.



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Overview

System and Program Indicator Reports are published quarterly and furnished to CSB trustees and the Continuum of Care. All reports are posted to www.csb.org. Results are also shared with CSB funders consistent with funding contracts and agreements.

The System and Program Indicator Report monitors the current CSB funded programs and some non-CSB funded programs that participate in our data system. The report evaluates each system and program based on a system or program goal, actual performance data, variances, and outcome achievements. Outcome achievement is defined as 90% or better of numerical goal or within 5 percentage points of a percentage goal, except where a lesser or greater value than this variance also indicates an achieved goal. Systems or programs which meet less than one-half of outcome goals are considered to be a "program of concern". The following key is used to express outcome achievement status for each indicator:

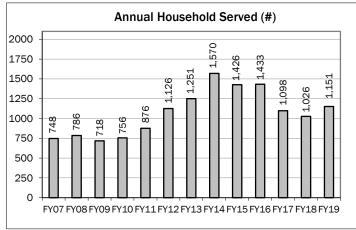

12 percent more households needed shelter compared to the last fiscal year. The success rate at exit from shelters decreased 20 percentage points to the lowest measured
rate historically. The length of time homeless increased, causing the nightly occupancy to reach a record high. The employment rate at entry increased from the FY18 rate of
36% to 40% currently, coupled with an increase in average income (FY18 \$712). An additional 246 families stayed in the Overnight shelter program only, waiting for a face-to-
face shelter eligibility assessment. These families were subsequently either diverted from shelter or self-exited.

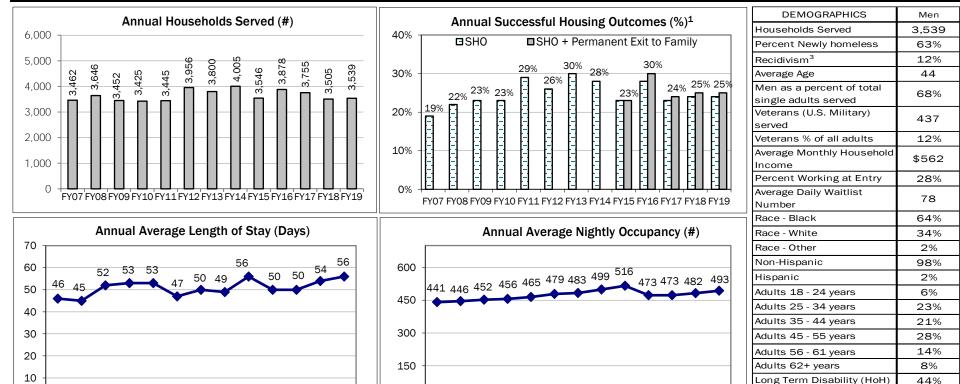

The number of single men sheltered remained flat when compared to the last fiscal year. The success rate at exit remained at 25% and the average length of time increased by 2 days. The rapid re-housing program now only serves individuals with high needs and barriers, per HUD guidelines, which negatively impacts outcome achievement. The employment rate at entry increased from the FY18 rate of 26% to 28% currently, coupled with an increase in average income (FY18 \$530).

The number of single women sheltered decreased 2% when compared to the last fiscal year. The success rate at exit is at the lowest rate measured historically. The employment rate at entry increased from the FY18 annual rate of 25% to 29% currently, while average income increased from \$502 to \$607. The rapid re-housing program now only serves individuals with high needs and barriers, per HUD guidelines, which negatively impacts outcome achievement.

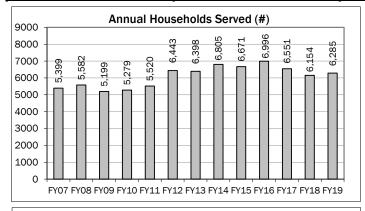

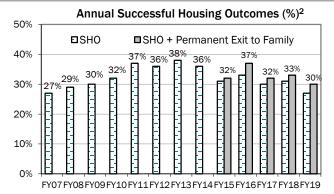

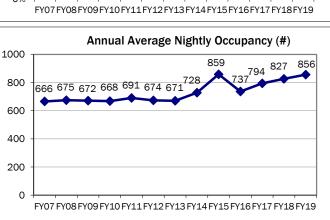

The system experienced a 2% increase in the number of households sheltered when compared to the last fiscal year. The successful housing outcomes percent decreased 3 percentage points compared to the prior fiscal year. The average length of time homeless and the nightly occupancy increased slightly. The employment rate and average income increased compared to the FY18 rate (\$550, 27%). 67% of sheltered households did not experience homelessness within the prior two years. 130 individuals were on the waiting list for shelter each day, on average, when overflow beds were not open.

numbers served. The current capacity of Permanent Supportive Housing units included in Columbus Service Point (CSP) and reported on here is 1926. VA VASH voucher capacity of 364 is
not included.

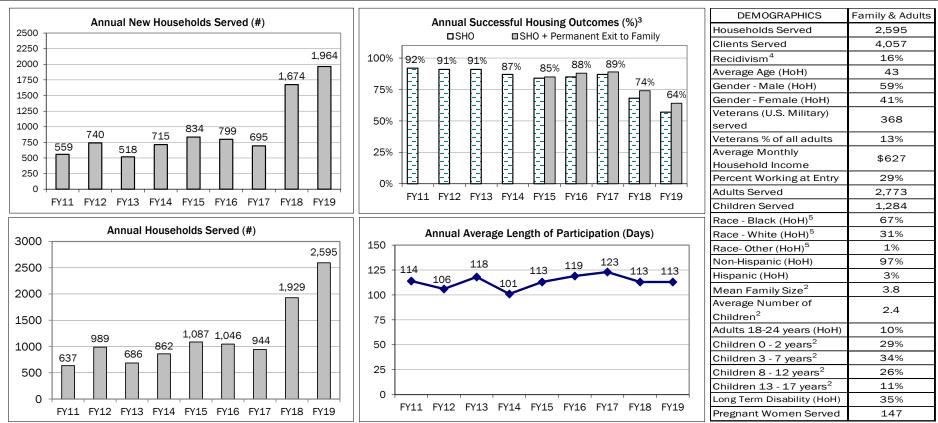

The system served 35% more households than the last fiscal year, due to full operation of the rapid re-housing program for single adults, but was still below goal as both the family and single adult rapid rehousing providers served less households than projected. The employment rate and average income increased compared to FY18 (26%, \$555). The 6 month recidivism rate increased from 9% in FY18 to 16% in FY19. The rapid rehousing programs now only serve households with high needs and barriers, per HUD guidelines, which negatively impacts outcome achievement.

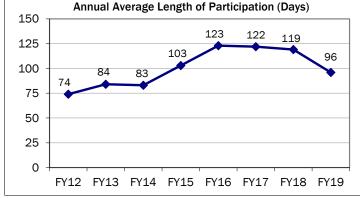






DEMOGRAPHICS





The number of households served increased 18% when compared to the last fiscal year. The number of veterans served more than doubled compared to the last fiscal year. The success
rate at program exit decreased 9 percentage points. 54% of households are stable in their own housing and 23% decided to permanently move in with family/friends, a continued high
rate for family/friends move-ins. Percent working at entry decreased compared to FY18 annual rate (54%) showing better targeting and prioritization of households at greater risk of
homelessness. The annual recidivism rate increased from 7% in FY18 to 12% in FY19.

The success rate at exit from the Rapid Re-housing program is at 55%, increased from the FY18 rate of 53%. 1,612 (41%) of the individuals served in shelter during the reporting period were enrolled in the rapid re-housing program during the same timeframe. The six-month recidivism rate increased to 21% from the previous fiscal year's rate of 16%. The Rapid Re-housing program was retooled effective 7/1/2017 with YMCA providing rapid re-housing case management services. The rapid re-housing program is only serving individuals with high needs and barriers.
