Our network includes partners delivering an array of services including homelessness prevention, shelter, rapid re-housing, street outreach, and supportive housing.

Community Shelter Board sets specific outcomes with each partner agency, and performance is measured and reported in the accompanying report. We monitor data constantly to track how effectively the system is working to move people to stable housing. We partner with agencies both individually and as a system to continuously improve results.

Along the way, we relish the opportunity to take a moment to recognize the tireless efforts by these partners delivering critical services to those facing homelessness.



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Overview

System and Program Indicator Reports are published quarterly and furnished to CSB trustees and the Continuum of Care. All reports are posted to www.csb.org. Results are also shared with CSB funders consistent with funding contracts and agreements.

The System and Program Indicator Report monitors the current CSB funded programs and some non-CSB funded programs that participate in our data system. The report evaluates each system and program based on a system or program goal, actual performance data, variances, and outcome achievements. Outcome achievement is defined as 90% or better of numerical goal or within 5 percentage points of a percentage goal, except where a lesser or greater value than this variance also indicates an achieved goal. Systems or programs which meet less than one-half of outcome goals are considered to be a "program of concern". The following key is used to express outcome achievement status for each indicator:

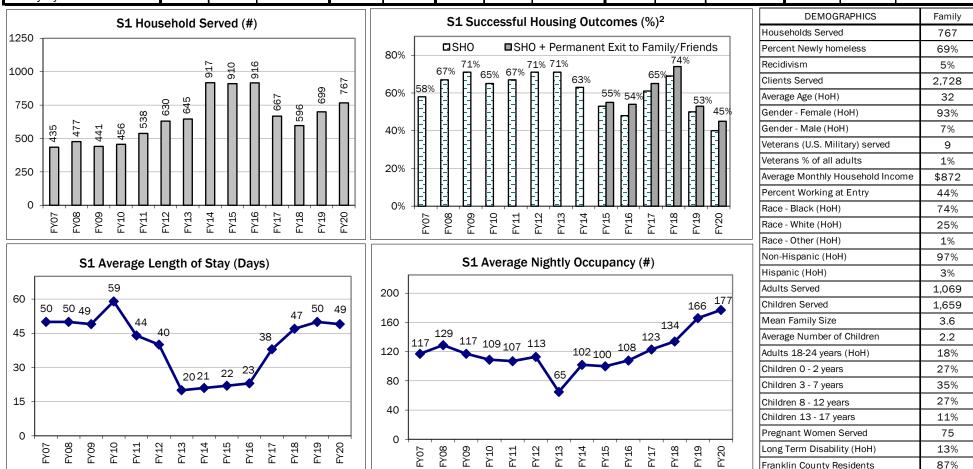

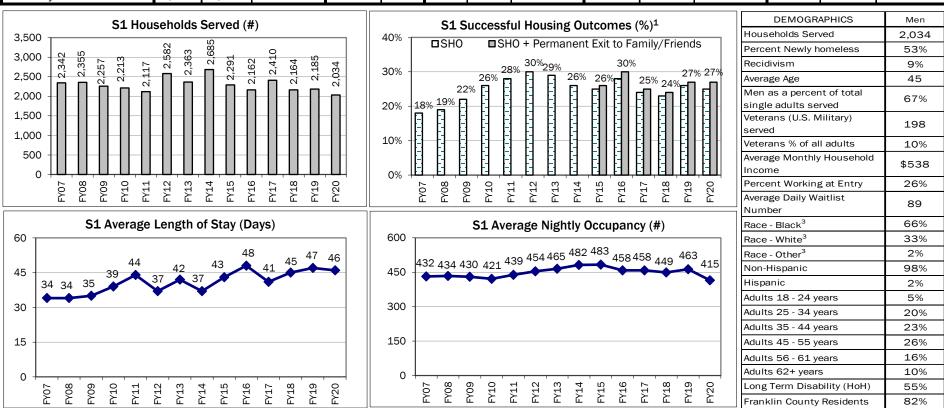
10 percent more households needed shelter compared to the same period of last fiscal year, reaching the highest occupancy rate historically for the reporting period. The success rate at exit from shelters decreased 8 percentage points, impacted by the high number of families served and the difficult housing environment. The employment rate at entry increased from the FY19 rate of 40% to 44% currently, coupled with an increase in average income (FY19 \$768). An additional 29 families stayed in the Overnight shelter program only, waiting for a face-to-face shelter eligibility assessment. These families were subsequently either diverted from shelter or self-exited.

The number of single men sheltered decreased 7% when compared to the same reporting period of last fiscal year due to Volunteers of America closing their 40 bed men's shelter and the late opening of winter overflow beds. The success rate at exit remained flat at 27% and the average length of time decreased by 1 day. The long term disability rate jumped by 10 percentage points compared to the same reporting period of last fiscal year. The rapid re-housing program now only serves individuals with high needs and barriers, per HUD guidelines, which makes outcome achievement more difficult. The employment rate at entry decreased from the FY19 rate of 28% to 26% currently, coupled with a slight decrease in average income (FY19 \$562).

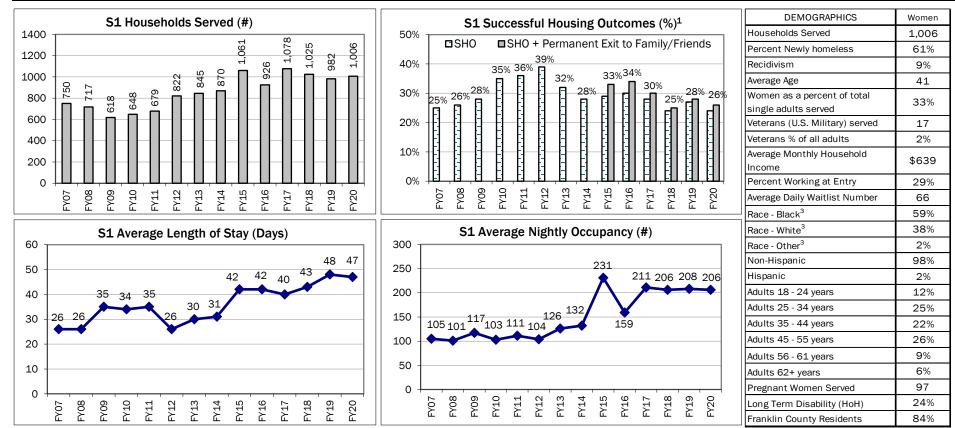

The number of single women sheltered increased 2% when compared to the same reporting period of last fiscal year. The success rate at exit is at 26%. The employment rate at entry remained flat at the FY19 annual rate of 29%, while average income increased from \$607 to \$639. The rapid re-housing program now only serves individuals with high needs and barriers, per HUD guidelines, which makes outcome achievement more difficult.

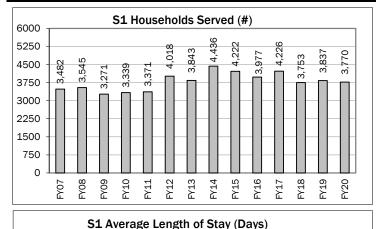

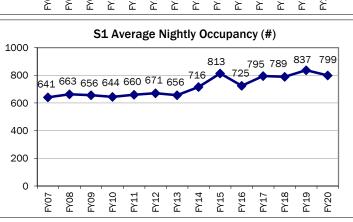

The system experienced a 2% decrease in the number of households sheltered when compared to the same period of last fiscal year due to the decrease in the number of single adults sheltered. The number of veterans and pregnant women who needed shelter decreased by 84 (27%) and 39 (19%) respectively, during the same timeframe. The successful housing outcomes percent remained flat compared to the same period of last fiscal year. The average length of time homeless decreased slightly. The nightly occupancy decreased accounting for Volunteers of America closing their 40 bed men's shelter. The employment rate and average income increased compared to the FY19 rate (\$610, 30%). 59% of sheltered households did not experience homelessness within the prior two years. 155 individuals were on the waiting list for shelter each day, on average, prior to the start of winter overflow.

The number of households served decreased 13% when compared to the same reporting period of last fiscal year, due to the funding instability for the reporting period. The number of veterans served increased 28% (15) compared to the same reporting period of last fiscal year. The success rate at program exit increased 15 percentage points. 54% of households are stable in their own housing and 35% decided to permanently move in with family/friends. Percent working at entry decreased compared to FY19 annual rate (51%) showing better targeting and prioritization of households at greater risk of homelessness. The annual recidivism rate increased by 6 percentage points compared to last fiscal year.

The number served remained flat when compared to the same reporting period of last fiscal year. The system employment rate of 28% remains about the same as the FY19 rate of 29% and the average income of \$649 increased compared to FY19 (\$627). The rapid rehousing programs now only serve households with high needs and barriers, per HUD guidelines, which makes outcome achievement more difficult.

The success rate at exit from the Rapid Re-housing program is at 50%, decreased from the FY19 annual rate of 55%. 700 (31%) of the individuals served in shelter during the reporting period were enrolled in the rapid re-housing program during the same timeframe. The Rapid Re-housing program was retooled effective 7/1/2017 with YMCA providing rapid re-housing case management services. The rapid re-housing program is only serving individuals with high needs and barriers.
