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Overview

System and Program Indicator Reports are published quarterly and furnished to CSB trustees and the Continuum of Care. All reports are posted to <u>www.csb.org</u>. Results are also shared with CSB funders consistent with funding contracts and agreements.

The System and Program Indicator Report monitors the current CSB funded programs and some non-CSB funded programs that participate in our data system. The report evaluates each system and program based on a system or program goal, actual performance data, variances, and outcome achievements. Outcome achievement is defined as 90% or better of numerical goal or within 5 percentage points of a percentage goal, except where a lesser or greater value than this variance also indicates an achieved goal. Systems or programs which meet less than one-half of outcome goals are considered to be a "program of concern". The following key is used to express outcome achievement status for each indicator:

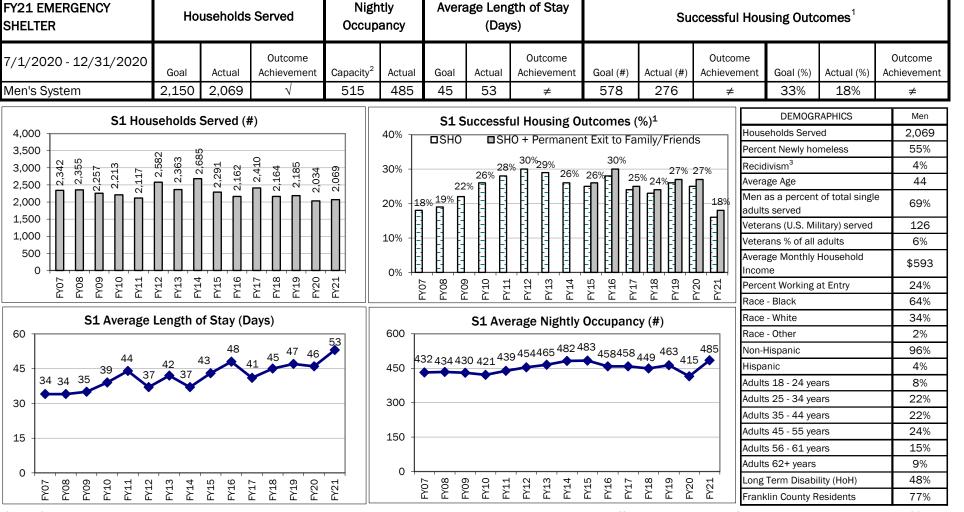

Covid-19 had a direct impact on the metrics monitored this period as re-housing activities were extremely difficult. 51% less households needed shelter when compared to the same period of FY20, likely impacted by the eviction moratorium, stimulus funds and unemployment benefits. This is the lowest number of families needing shelter in the past 15 years. The success rate at exit from shelters remained at 45% same as in FY20. The average length of shelter stay increased 8 days to 57 days. The employment rate at entry decreased from the FY20 annual rate of 41% to 35% currently, while the average income increased to \$869 (FY20 \$847). An additional 22 families stayed in the Overnight shelter program only, waiting for a face-to-face shelter eligibility assessment. These families were subsequently either diverted from shelter or self-exited. ¹Overflow capacity is not included.

Covid-19 had a direct impact on the metrics monitored this period as re-housing activities were extremely difficult. The number of single men served increased 2% when compared to the same period of the last fiscal year, as overflow capacity was open throughout the reporting period. The success rate decreased 9 percentage points to 18%. The average length of time homeless increased 7 days from the prior reporting period to 53 days. The employment rate at entry increased to 24% compared to the FY20 annual rate of 19%, coupled with an increase in average income (FY20 \$414). The rapid re-housing program now only serves individuals with high needs and barriers, which makes outcome achievement more difficult.

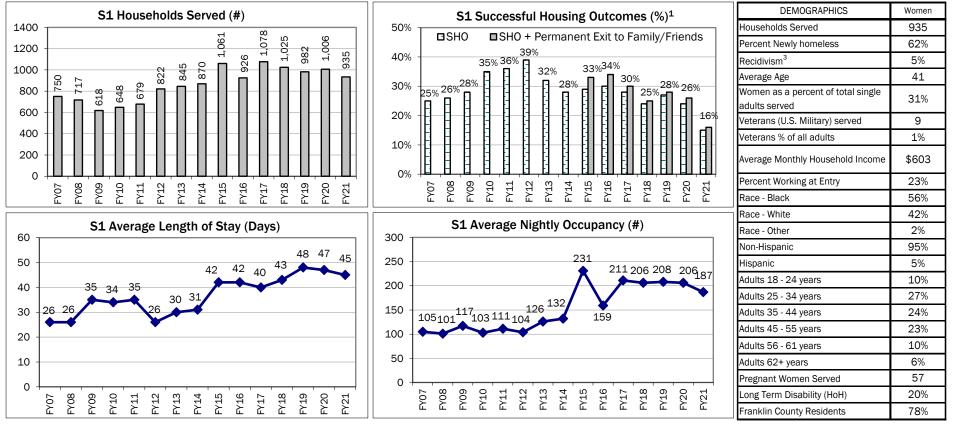

Covid-19 had a direct impact on the metrics monitored this period as re-housing activities were extremely difficult. The number of single women served decreased 7% when compared to the same period of the last fiscal year. The success rate decreased 10 percentage points to 16%. The average length of time homeless decreased by 2 days. The employment rate at entry decreased 3 percentage points to 23% when compared to the FY20 annual rate of 26%, while average income increased from \$587 to \$603. The rapid re-housing program now only serves individuals with high needs and barriers, per HUD guidelines, which makes outcome achievement more difficult.

Covid-19 had a direct impact on the metrics monitored this period as re-housing activities were extremely difficult. The system experienced an 11% decrease in the number of households sheltered, driven by the decrease in family homelessness. The number of veterans and pregnant women who needed shelter decreased by 85 (38%) and 68 (40%) respectively, during the same timeframe. The successful housing outcome rate decreased 12 percentage points compared to the same period of last fiscal year, to it lowest level measured historically. The average length of time homeless increased by 4 days to 51 days. The average income increased when compared to the FY20 annual rate (\$554). 59% of sheltered households did not experience homelessness within the prior two years.

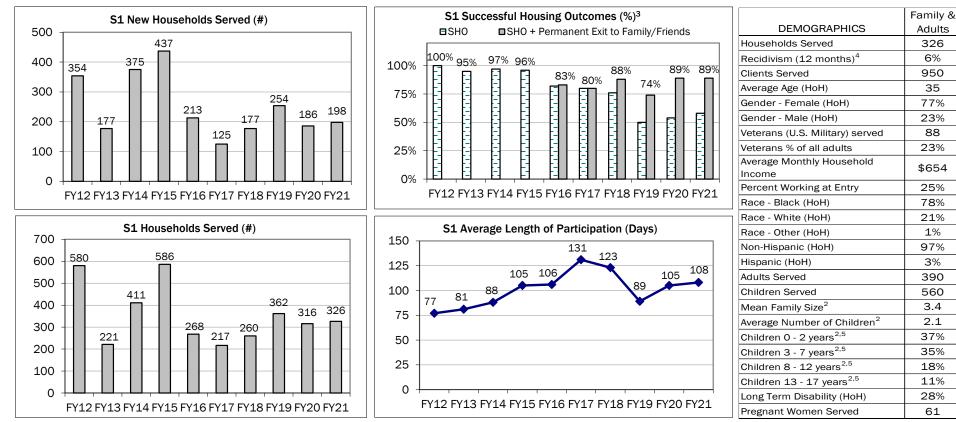

The number of households served increased 3% when compared to the same reporting period of the last fiscal year. At exit, 58% of households are stable in their own housing and 31% decided to permanently move in with family/friends. The recidivism rate decreased by 9 percentage points. The percent working at entry decreased compared to the FY20 annual rate (38%) to 25% currently, coupled with a decrease in income from \$840 to \$654, showing improved targeting of households served. The number of veterans and pregnant women served increased compared to the same reporting period of last fiscal year by 29% and 26% respectively. The increases in these numbers corelate with the decrease in number served for the same populations in emergency shelter.

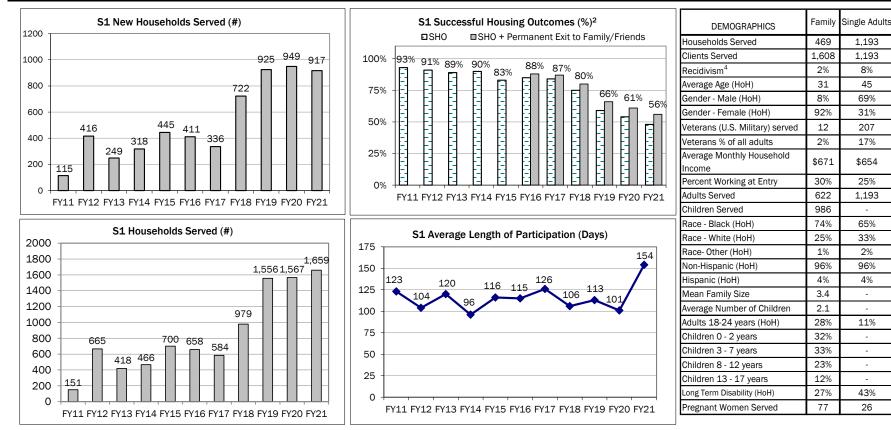

The number served increased 6% when compared to the same reporting period of last fiscal year. Re-housing activities were extremely difficult in the COVID-19 environment. The success rate at exit decreased by 5 percentage points, to 56% currently and the length of participation significantly increased. The number of veterans served decreased compared to the same timeframe of last year. For single adults, the disability rate of those served is 11 percentage points higher than last year. The rapid rehousing programs now only serve households with high needs and barriers, which makes outcome achievement more difficult.

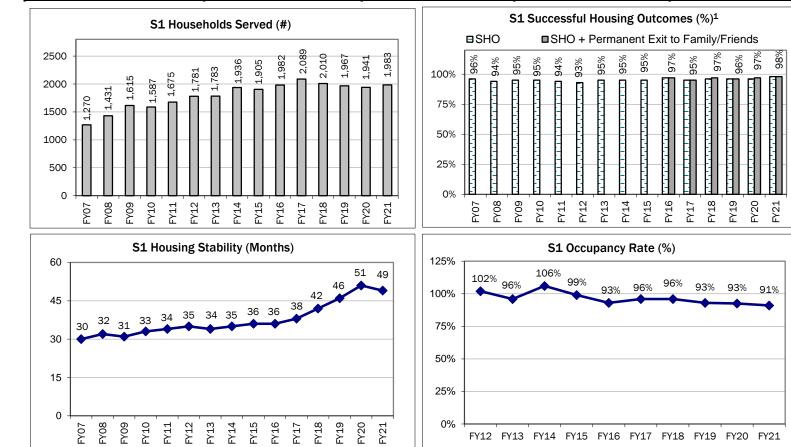

The system continues to perform well with a 2% increase in numbers served. A number of projects transitioned to a new provider, which caused the occupancy rate to be below goal. The number of PSH residents that passed away during the evaluation period is 44 or 2% of the PSH population and 91% higher than the same timeframe of the last fiscal year, a very high rate. CSB is looking into the cause of this issue. The current capacity of **Permanent Supportive Housing** units included in Community Services Portal (CSP) and reported on here is 2027. VA VASH voucher capacity of 377 is not included.

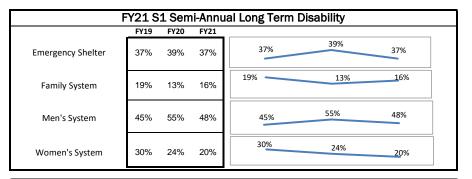
