

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#### Overview

System and Program Indicator Reports are published quarterly and furnished to CSB trustees and the Continuum of Care. All reports are posted to <a href="www.csb.org">www.csb.org</a>. Results are also shared with CSB funders consistent with funding contracts and agreements.

The System and Program Indicator Report monitors the current CSB funded programs and some non-CSB funded programs that participate in our data system. The report evaluates each system and program based on a system or program goal, actual performance data, variances, and outcome achievements. Outcome achievement is defined as 90% or better of numerical goal or within 5 percentage points of a percentage goal, except where a lesser or greater value than this variance also indicates an achieved goal. Systems or programs which meet less than one-half of outcome goals are considered to be a "program of concern". The following key is used to express outcome achievement status for each indicator:

System-level race and gender-based outcome disparities are included in the report. A disparity is defined as a demographic achieving a successful exit that is at least five percentage points less than the respective percentage of the demographic population served in each system.

All data generated from the Homeless Management Information System (HMIS) and used in the report met CSB quality assurance standards, which require current and accurate data and a 95% completion rate for all required HMIS data variables.

The system served the same number of families when compared to the same reporting period of FY22 but the average nightly occupancy was at the highest level recorded historically. The success rate at exit from shelters remained flat at 33%, the lowest rate recorded historically. The average length of shelter stay increased by 8 days, to another record high. Lack of available safe, decent, affordable housing is making it very difficult to successfully move families out of shelter quickly. The employment rate at entry decreased from the FY22 annual rate of 31% to 29% currently and the average income decreased to \$699 (FY22 \$764), further affecting the ability to find housing. 7% of families had more than one shelter stay during the timeframe. An additional 65 families stayed in the Overnight shelter program only, an unusually high number, waiting for a face-to-face shelter eligibility assessment. These families were subsequently either helped to find an alternative to shelter or self-resolved.



The number of single men sheltered decreased 6% when compared to the same reporting period of the prior fiscal year as sheltering capacity decreased for the first time since the onset of COVID-19, creating a shelter waitlist that averaged 88 people daily. The success rate increased by 2 percentage points to 15%. Lack of available safe, decent, affordable housing is making it very difficult to successfully move individuals out of shelter quickly. The average length of time homeless increased slightly. The employment rate at entry decreased 5 percentage points to 19% when compared to the FY22 annual rate of 24%, and the average income decreased to \$615 (FY22 \$644). 386 men (32%) had multiple stays in shelter during the timeframe. The rate of adults 62+ increased by 9 percentage points to 16% since the same reporting period of the prior fiscal year (7%).



The number of single women sheltered decreased 13% when compared to the same reporting period of the prior fiscal year. The success rate at exit increased by 3 percentage points to 16%. Lack of available safe, decent, affordable housing is making it very difficult to successfully move individuals out of shelter quickly. The average length of time homeless increased by 4 days to 63 days. The employment rate at entry decreased by 2 percentage points to 20% when compared to the FY22 annual rate of 22%, and the average income remained flat (FY22 \$661). 124 women (24%) had multiple stays in shelter during the timeframe. The shelter waitlist averaged 51 people daily. The rate of adults 62+ and women self-declaring as disabled increased by 5 percentage points since last year (7%, 69%).

The number served by the system decreased 7% when compared to the same reporting period of the prior fiscal year as sheltering capacity for single adults decreased for the first time since the onset of COVID-19. The successful housing outcome rate increased 2 percentage points to 18%. Lack of available safe, decent, affordable housing is making it very difficult to successfully move individuals and families out of shelter quickly. The average length of time homeless increased by 4 days to a record high of 65 days. The average income decreased to \$640 when compared to the FY22 annual rate of \$670. The system served 20 more (20% increase) veterans and 12 more (24% increase) pregnant women when compared to the same reporting period of FY22 (98, 50).



The number of households served decreased 5% when compared to the same reporting period of the prior fiscal year. The successful housing outcome rate increased by 6 percentage points to 92%. At exit,
66% of households are stable in their own housing and 26% decided to permanently move in with family/friends. The average length of participation in the programs increased significantly by 67 days, on
average. The percent working at entry increased compared to the FY22 annual rate of 37% to 39% currently. The number of veterans served increased by 13 (30% increase) and the number of pregnant
women served increased by 13 (23% increase) when compared to the same reporting period in FY22 (43, 56).







The number served increased 7% when compared to the same reporting period of the previous year. Rapid Re-housing providers are struggling to keep programs staffed, which directly impacts the number served and they are reporting continued difficulty securing low-income, affordable housing. The success rate at exit increased 6 percentage points to 62 percent and the length of participation increased by 9 days. The rate of self reported disability decreased by 3 percentage points for both population types compared to last year's rates (FY22 Families: 48%, Single Adults: 80%).





The system had a 7% increase in numbers served. The occupancy rate decreased to 86% due to 1. difficulty in finding scattered sites affordable housing to rent in the community; 2. overstated capacity for a program in comparison to the available funding, an issue that will be corrected next fiscal year; and 3. low occupancy in a couple of site based facilities due to property management issues and issues related to slow unit turnover and mismatch of unit availability and demand of units by youth households. The current capacity of Permanent Supportive Housing units in HMIS and reported on here is 2,456. VA VASH voucher capacity of 377 is not included.

The system-wide number of families served increased by 2% (FY22 1,216) when compared to the same reporting period of the prior fiscal year. While the rate of families receiving homelessness prevention services decreased by 14% (FY22 492), the rate of families in emergency shelter stayed about the same (FY22 338) during the same timeframe. The rate of families in permanent supportive housing increased by 20% (FY22 263). The rate of Black/African American families and womenheaded families served system-wide is substantially disproportionate compared to the Franklin County population in poverty. From an outcomes perspective, the homelessness system has no substantial impact on these families.

The system-wide number of pregnant women served remained flat when compared to the same reporting period of the prior fiscal year. Pregnant women served by homelessness prevention increased by 23% and rapid re-housing decreased by 18% (FY22 56, 44). The number served by emergency shelters increased by 24% (FY22 50) when compared to prior fiscal year. The rate of Black/African American women served system-wide is substantially disproportionate compared to the Franklin County population and to the Franklin County population in poverty. From an outcomes perspective, the homelessness system has no substantial impact on these pregnant women.





The system-wide number of veterans served increased 9% when compared to the same period of the prior fiscal year (FY22 814). The number of veterans receiving homelessness prevention services increased by 30% (FY22 43), the number of veterans in emergency shelter increased by 20% (FY22 98) and the number in transitional housing increased by 21% (FY22 42). The number of veterans served in rapid re-housing increased by 37% (FY22 166) and the number in permanent supportive housing decreased by 4% (FY22 597) when compared to the prior fiscal year. The rate of Black/African American veterans served system-wide is substantially disproportionate compared to the Franklin County veteran population. From an outcomes perspective, the homelessness system has no substantial impact on these veterans.





The number of transition age youth served increased 7% (FY22 615) when compared to the same reporting period of the prior fiscal year. The number of youth served by homelessness prevention remained flat (FY22 133), the number of youth served in PSH increased by 8% (FY22 115), and youth in rapid re-housing increased by 19% (FY22 172). The number of youth served in emergency shelters decreased by 9% (FY22 219) and transitional housing increased by 13% (FY22 64). The rate of Black/African American youth and female youth served system-wide is substantially disproportionate compared to the Franklin County population and to the Franklin County population in poverty. From an outcomes perspective, the homelessness system has no substantial impact on these youth. In add ition, the high rate of homeless Black/African American underage and young adult girls shows a system failure that must be addressed with urgency.


