FOR THE POINT-IN-TIME COUNT

Thursday, January 25, 2024

The 2024 point-in-time count of people experiencing homelessness in Columbus and Franklin County will be held on Thursday, January 25, 2024.

Community Shelter Board will lead Columbus' and Franklin County's annual count of the area's sheltered and unsheltered homeless populations, including adults, youth, and children. Point-in-time counts are an important method used to better understand the extent and nature of homelessness in communities across the nation. The count helps us address housing needs in our community and helps track progress toward the goal of ending homelessness.

Volunteer opportunities include:

- Conducting surveys on the ground and in encampments for unsheltered people experiencing homelessness
- Conducting surveys at a magnet site in tandem with a mobile outreach unit and food truck
- Conducting surveys at meal sites and warming centers.

Several time slots are available.

You'll be asked to choose up to three options. Assignments will be made based on the number of site locations and available volunteers.
