

# Vision & Goal



#### **Vision:**

All youth have a safe place to call home

#### Framework Goal:

Achieve and sustain an effective end to homelessness among unaccompanied youth and parenting youth

# **Current Strategies**

(pre-YHDP)

Further develop and maintain an up-to-date list of all youth who are literally homeless, 1 including youth who are unsheltered or unsafely housed, and related case conferencing to address complex issues and assure efficient, effective assistance Develop access points, shelter options, and services that are tailored for youth as part of the 2 larger homeless crisis response system Explore and develop additional permanent housing options appropriate for youth, such as 3 shared housing, rapid re-housing, and permanent supportive housing Further develop and support the Youth Action Board and inclusion of youth in system development and oversight

# YHDP & Coordinated Community Plan

#### Award:

- \$6.07M over two years to CSB
- Requires 25% match public/private funding and in-kind
- Must be eligible under HUD CoC Program may request waivers to meet youth needs
- Project funding renewed annually thereafter through the CoC Program Competition
- Use as part of larger funding strategy to build comprehensive response

#### Focus:

Youth age 24 & under who are at-risk of or experiencing homelessness, including unaccompanied and pregnant or parenting youth

#### Timeline:

July-November: Plan development

November 13, 2018: Initial plan due to HUD

March 13, 2019: Final HUD approval (or sooner)

TBD 2019: CCP implementation (YHDP + all other projects/activities to

achieve CCP)

# Coordinated Community Plan

#### **Coordinated Community Plan (CCP) Components:**

- Needs analysis & system modeling (including program models)
- 3-Year goals, objectives, action steps
- Identify new projects to be funded by HUD and other sources
- Governance structure
- Plan for continuous improvement

#### **Principles & practices that must be addressed:**

- USICH criteria/benchmarks & framework to end youth homelessness
- Special populations (e.g., LGBTQ+, victims of sexual trafficking)
- Positive youth development (PYD) and trauma-informed care (TIC)
- Family engagement
- Housing First
- Youth choice
- Individualized supports
- Social and community integration
- Coordinated entry

# Coordinated Community Plan

#### **Focus Areas:**

#### **Prevention:**

Community-based and youth-serving system (e.g., foster care, education, justice) strategies for identifying and assisting at-risk youth in the community to prevent homelessness

#### Shelter & Re-Housing:

Homeless crisis response system strategies that are developmentally appropriate and assure ready access to shelter and re-housing assistance when homelessness is not prevented

#### Stabilization & Connections:

Community-based and youth-serving system strategies for providing immediate access to critical developmental and supportive services that support housing stability, education and employment needs, foster permanent and healthy relationships, and the social-emotional-physical well-being of youth

# Innovative YHDP Project Concepts: R1

#### Rapid Rehousing

#### NE Michigan, Austin, TX; Santa Cruz, CA; SE Kentucky: State of CT

- Waivers to serve youth under 18 years old by leasing apartments
- Extending length of time of eligible rental assistance and supportive services up to 36 months (RA) and 42 months (SS) w/ young people who need a "longer runway"

#### Joint TH-RRH

#### Austin, TX; Santa Cruz, CA

- Addressing emergency shelter gap for 18-24 TAY
- Housing focused TH

# Coordinated Entry & Housing Navigation State of CT; Kentucky

 Improving system and expanding capacity for youth

#### Prevention/Diversion (Austin, TX; Santa Cruz; State of CT)

- Focus on Family Reunification
- Safety planning
- Creative problem solving

#### Host Homes-(Anchorage, AK; SE Kentucky; San Francisco. CA)

- Targeting both prevention and literal homelessness
- Support service funding offered as part of program
- Anchorage targets
   LGBTQ population


