Funding Recommendations Released

On February 9, CSB's Board of Trustees reviewed the proposed FY11 distribution of funding among our Rebuilding Lives strategies of Access, Crisis Response, and Transition. The attached funding recommendation is a preliminary allocation of funding by program. Final program funding is contingent on approval by CSB's Board of Trustees on May 25, 2010.

CSB will award funds with the goal of maintaining a community system of services, shelter, and housing. Progress will continue on the new strategies contained in the Rebuilding Lives plan and endorsed by the Rebuilding Lives Funder Collaborative. Funding will continue to be linked to results that demonstrate effectiveness and efficiency.

As a reminder, Gateway materials from all agencies, both CSB-funded and non-funded are due to CSB no later than <u>5:00 pm on Friday, March 19, 2010</u>.

HPRP Stimulus Dollars at Work

Thanks to Homelessness Prevention and Rapid Re-Housing Program (HPRP) funding, a Centralized Point of Access for the adult shelter system will be piloted beginning early this year. The two year pilot program operated by Faith Mission will establish a common point of access for homeless single adults experiencing a housing crisis. It is also intended to develop stronger links to community resources to prevent homelessness.

Faith Mission continues to coordinate and collaborate with the other shelter providers to lay the groundwork for smooth implementation of the project. Developmental work around policies and procedures and coordinating activities are in progress. A memorandum of agreement between system stakeholders should be completed soon. Faith Mission and CSB are also in the process of completing the contract for the project. The project will be fully implemented by March 2010.

Rebuilding Lives Funder Collaborative

Leasing Project

The Rebuilding Lives Leasing Project with Southeast, Inc as the project sponsor began operation during January. Plans call for 5 individuals to be housed by the end of February. Lease up will be completed by June 2010. This project serves as an expansion of the Scattered Sites project. Funding is through HUD's Supportive Housing Program and will be used to support housing subsidy costs for approximately 30 Rebuilding Lives eligible individuals who meet the federal definition for chronic homeless persons. The Unified Supportive Housing System will provide lease-up support and ongoing vacancy management for the project.

[CONTINUUM OF CARE]

CSB Surveys Homeless Overnight

Approximately 100 volunteers worked overnight on January 26 to participate in the Annual Point in Time Count of Unsheltered Persons. CSB extends a special **thank you** to all the volunteers including the students from World Harvest Bible College who prepared and served the Volunteer Appreciation Breakfast. The Homeless Count Workgroup reviewed the count data at its final meeting on February 11. The next steps are for the count data to be compared to Columbus ServicePoint data and then compiled into a report for the Columbus & Franklin County Continuum of Care Steering Committee. Final data results will be available for distribution in late March.

[PROGRAM UPDATES]

Winter Beds in Use

The extended cold weather has caused the emergency shelters to remain at or near capacity for the month of January. An average of 147 men has accessed Winter Overflow on a nightly basis, compared to an average of 96 during the first few days of December. Utilization at the women's shelters increased to an average of 18 women utilizing winter overflow versus 16 for the same period last month. Shelter providers continue to communicate and coordinate their efforts to ensure that homeless individuals are afforded shelter from the elements.

Job2Housing

Progress continues on the implementation of the Job2Housing project. CSB and the Salvation Army are involved in the completion of the contracting process. TSA and CSB will meet to discuss policies and procedures, hiring and training of staff and the development of the processes needed to implement the project.

The project is designed to operate over a three-year period, will serve 120 homeless families with children who meet HUD's Rapid Re-Housing eligibility threshold and who also have insufficient income to afford an apartment and are committed to pursuing employment to achieve family self-sufficiency. J2H will provide housing placement, leasing assistance for 6 months, and employment focused case management.

Dave Davis, CSB's director of programs and planning, attended the Ending Homelessness Conference in San Diego February 10-12. The annual event is offered by the National Alliance to End Homelessness. Dave also attended a special meeting of NAEH's Leadership Council, of which he is a member, to discuss federal policy priorities.

Housing Inspector

Federal stimulus funding will allow CSB to add a Housing Inspector to its staff very soon. This person will ensure compliance with federal standards regarding housing habitability and rent reasonableness for CSB's direct client financial assistance programs receiving Homelessness Prevention and Rapid Re-housing Program (stimulus) funds. A finalist will be selected and an offer made within the month.

Policies & Procedures Reviewed

CSB staff conducted an extensive review and update of all administrative policies and procedures this past Fall. Procedures were streamlined where possible, expanded where necessary to incorporate Homelessness Prevention and Rapid Re-housing programs, and revised in response to the board's tightening of executive limitations. An in-service was held with all staff on January 14.

United Way Giving Campaign a Success

CSB's United Way giving campaign was a complete success. Chaired by Melanie Woodrum, the campaign continued the tradition of 100% giving participation by staff. We celebrated at Café Ephesus on February 3.
